The Performance Trap

We define ourselves by what we do instead of by who we are.

Good is never good enough, but God is God enough

Colossians 1:21 "This includes you who were once far away from God. You were his enemies, separated from him by your evil thoughts and actions. ***New Living Translation***

Hagios - hag-ee-os: Consecrated, Divine claim or ownership – Not a result of personal character or being "good" but being set apart by God as his own.

Ephesians 1:4 Even before he made the world, God loved us and **chose** us in Christ to be holy and without fault in his eyes. *New Living Translation*
